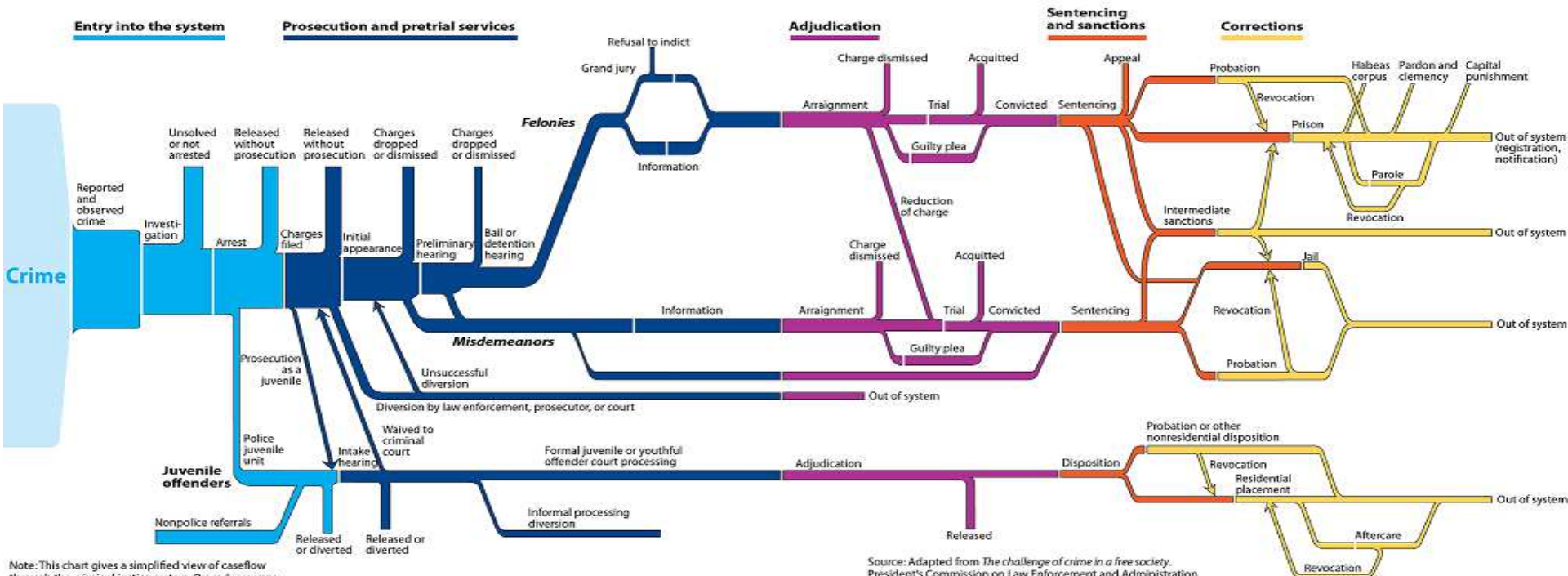

Characteristics of a System

- Any collection of related parts that interact in an organized way for a purpose.

Criminal Justice Is A System
