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Summer Program 2016 Overview

Summer Bridge Program 2016 - For Incoming 9th Grade Students

The School District of Philadelphia is providing the Summer Bridge Program to support incoming 9th grade students at all Philadelphia Comprehensive High Schools (or School of the Future). This program will serve up to 100 students in each of the 21 GEAR UP and/or comprehensive high schools (approximately 2100 students served), and is designed to promote a successful transition to high school, improve the quality of relationships between new students, teachers, and staff, and to create a college-going culture embraced by students prior to enrolling in the fall. The program is slated for July 5 - July 29, 2016.

Eligible high schools: Overbrook, Ben Franklin, South Philadelphia, Fels, Edison, George Washington, Penn Treaty, Kensington Urban/Business, Strawberry Mansion, Bartram, Frankford, Kensington Health, Roxborough, Lincoln, Northeast, Furness, West Philadelphia, Kensington CAPA, ML King, Sayre, and School of the Future.

Credit Recovery - Senior Center - 2016

11th Grade students enrolled in the School District of Philadelphia as indicated in the School Computer Network (SCN) are eligible. Students can remediate no more than two (2) credit recovery classes in the area of English, history, math, science or Spanish

12th Grade students enrolled in the School District of Philadelphia as indicated in the SCN are eligible. Students can remediate no more than two (2) credit recovery classes and or the Multi-Disciplinary Project and are eligible to graduate at the conclusion of summer program.

This program will serve approximately 1000 students.

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**Immigrant Children and Youth Summer Program
(ICY) 2016 Total Students (110)**

This program is for English Language Learners (ELLs) currently in grades 4 to 7 (rising 5th to 8th graders) who are new to the country (less than 3 years). The morning program will include instruction in literacy and math. School district teachers will teach these courses. The afternoon program includes enrichment courses in art, music, and drama. These courses are facilitated by community-based organizations.

**Extended School Year (ESY)- What is Extended School Year 2016?
Total Students (2260)**

Extended School Year (ESY) services are special education and related services provided to students with disabilities beyond the regular 180-day school year. The Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), the federal special education law, says that school districts, intermediate units, and charter schools must provide extended school year services if a student needs these services to receive a free appropriate public education (FAPE). In some cases, interruptions in the school schedule, such as summer break, will result in children with disabilities losing many of their basic skills and taking a long time to get those skills back once school begins again. ESY services are provided during breaks in the educational schedule to prevent this loss.

K – 7 Summer Programs Total Students (2890)

Summer Program is being offered to select students, currently in grades K-7, in Turnaround and Priority schools who need additional support to maintain their academic gains, as well as select students in other elementary/middle schools whose academic year was greatly impacted by an unfilled teacher vacancy. The program will address skills in reading/language arts and mathematics, with enrichment integrated throughout the program. Dates for program operation for students are July 6 to July 28, Monday thru Thursday, 8:30 AM to 12:30 PM. Students will receive breakfast and lunch. Transportation will not be provided.
