And that 14 was all done, and it's been all turned in 15 at this point and we're just now waiting 16 for the new assessment. 17 There's \$176,000 being held in 18 escrow from the sale of the property in order for -- until it gets released, but 19 there's also \$100,000 being held in 20 escrow for the RDA issue from 1987. 2.1 22 MR. WOODS: If you will, we 23 have the letter from the Board of Revision of Taxes saying that -- from May 2.4 25 18th saying that your market value appeal
